

Scoring Rubric for the FINAL PROJECT utilizing PhotoShop, Audition, MovieMaker (35% of total grade)

The Final Project is where everything comes together—all three components. You may approach the presentation in one of two ways: (1) If you present using PowerPoint, you must include graphic images that have been created using PhotoShop or a similar program, two or more audio files using Audition, Audacity or a similar program, and, video files that you have created and edited using MovieMaker or a similar program. (2) If you present using a video format, you must include graphic images and audio files as described above. Importing these file types into the video format will be explained.

REQUIREMENTS

1. Your project must be at least three minutes in duration, preferably no more than five minutes. The Final Project will be presented during the last class, Monday, April 19.
2. The presentation must contain all three technology components cited above.
3. The presentation topic should be something apropos to the humanities classroom, broadly relating to one of the following fields: history, philosophy, literature, physical sciences, social sciences, or the arts. The humanities involve inquiry into consciousness, values and ideals as they seek to describe how experiences shape our understanding of the world, so you have a pretty wide berth for your topic.
4. If every photo, graphic, video or sound file in the presentation is not original, then permission for its use must be cited in the ending credits if usage does not fall under the Fair Use Guidelines. <http://www.mediafestival.org/copyrightchart.html>
5. The project should be of professional quality in terms of technical production.

| 93-100 points | The project incorporates all three technology components, is at least three minutes in duration, effectively communicates the subject matter, cites usage of non-original media, is of professional quality with no obvious technical errors. |
| 85-92 points | Same specs as above, but the project is missing a tech component, or the duration is too short, or it does not effectively communicate the subject matter, or citations are missing, or there are one or two obvious technical errors. |
| 75-84 points | Same specs as above, but three or more errors or problems are apparent. Project is only marginally presentation-worthy. |
| 65-74 points | Same specs as above, but due to a significant number of obvious errors or problems, the project is not presentation-worthy. |
